



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
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Explore Northwoods & Lake Superior Region

Groups can enjoy tranquil forests, sophisticated cities and waterside retreats in Wisconsin's largest region

G eographically distinct from the rolling hills of the Driftless Area and busy cities of the Eastern Shores, Wisconsin's Northwoods and Lake Superior Region is an outdoor playground comprised of beautiful lake views, preserved national forests and cities filled with logging and pioneer history. Motorcoach groups have the opportunity to tour lumber baron mansions, relax on pontoon cruises and explore the waterfront communities that distinguish this welcoming Wisconsin region.

Scenically positioned along the Wisconsin River and considered the "Gateway to the Northwoods," **Wausau** combines cosmopolitan urban amenities with easy accessibility to Wisconsin's outdoor recreation activities. Its centralized location makes it ideal for hub-and-spoke travelers, and its culinary and architectural offerings will appeal to any group. Tours can begin at the Leigh Yawkey Woodson Art Museum, which is dedicated to the visual depiction of birds and hosts the internationally renowned "Birds in Art" exhibition. Groups can experience galleries in a preserved 1931 English Tudor-style mansion and explore the museum's tranquil sculpture garden at their own pace, or they can contact the museum in advance for a docent-led tour. Art aficionados should visit the city in September for the annual Artrageous Weekend to tour local galleries and explore the Andrew Warren Historic District.





The Wisconsin Great Northern Railroad takes passengers on a 15-mile scenic journey along the Namekagon River between Spooner and Springbrook.

Outdoor activities abound in Wausau, including Rib Mountain State Park. This four-season area welcomes groups to enjoy its hiking trails in the summer, fall foliage chairlift rides in the autumn and winter sport activities, including ski terrain and snowshoe trails. Join the 45 x 90 Club with a short hike to the 45 x 90 Geographical Marker. This precise geographical location is exactly halfway between the Equator and North Pole and a quarter-way around Earth, and visitors can take a photograph on the bronze marker after a brief walk over a crushed gravel pathway. Groups can contact the Wausau CVB for a commemorative coin and entry in the registration book. Seeking an agriculture component for your group itinerary? Marathon County produces over 95% of America's ginseng, and you can learn the health benefits of this Chinese root at Hsu's Ginseng Farm. Tours will explain the plant's multi-year maturation process, harvest and processing into products like medicine, tea and candy.

Groups can venture west to the city of **Chippewa Falls**, a historic logging community that now offers beer tastings, outdoor recreation and Victorian architecture. One of the finest examples of High Victorian Italiante design in Wisconsin, the Cook-Rutledge Mansion is an elegantly restored lumber baron home that was completed in 1887. Call in advance for a docent-led tour so your group can admire the intricately carved

woodwork, crystal chandeliers and five fireplaces. Learn more about the region's lumber heritage at the Chippewa Falls Museum of Industry & Technology, which explores the six major industries of Chippewa Falls and houses rare collections of World War I toy soldiers and military insignia patches. Today, Chippewa Falls' most famous export is Leinenkugel's, which has been producing its German-style lager since 1867. Group tours include stops at the Leinie Lodge to see vintage brewing equipment and the sampling bar to taste seasonal creations such as the Oktoberfest and Summer Shandy. More local flavors await at Autumn Harvest Winery & Orchard (where you can pair the winery's house-made Pinot Noir with Wisconsin cheeses), Chippewa River Distillery (which serves craft cocktails) and Brewster Bros. Brewing Company (flagship beers include a cream ale and timber stout).

Follow the Chippewa River downstream to **Eau Claire**, the Northwood's largest city and a glimpse into Wisconsin's logging past. Originally a sawmill hub and French trading post (Eau Claire translates to "clear water"), the city now welcomes groups with several museums and historic sites. Begin

at Carson Park, a 134-acre peninsula bordered by Half Moon Lake that was donated by lumber baron

William Carson. Here you can tour authentic 1890s cabins at the Paul Bunyan Logging Camp, admire unobstructed views of Braun's Bay and catch a baseball game at Carson Park (where legends like Hank Aaron, Joe Torre and Bob Uecker played). Groups are also welcome on the island's Chippewa Valley Museum, which features exhibits about local **Douglas County** abounds with natural beauty and historic sites that will appeal to your group. Fairlawn Mansion, an 1890 Victorian building, was originally home to the Pattison family before housing 2,000 children when it was converted into an orphanage. Today, groups can walk through the mansion's opulent ballroom, preserved bedrooms and

pioneer history and houses an authentic 1950s-style ice cream parlor that can accommodate up to 30 guests.

Continue north to Washburn County, which features railroad excursions, farm tours and DIY art activities to appeal to any interest. Orient your group at the Namekagon River Visitor Center, a National Park Service-operated building where guests can learn about the Namekagon River's tributary relationship to the St. Croix River and see detailed dioramas that depict Northwoods environments. Groups interested in history will want to spend time at the Washburn County Historical Museum, a preserved 1888 Lutheran Church that houses over 150 years of county history, and the Wisconsin Canoe Heritage Museum, which celebrates the golden age of North American canoeing with 25 antique watercraft. Located in an old Chicago & Northwestern depot in downtown Spooner, the Railroad Memories


Museum celebrates Midwestern railroading with equipment and memorabilia across 13 rooms, and the Wisconsin Great Northern Railroad transports groups through the St. Croix National Scenic Riverway with several themed meal rides.

Intersected by the Bois Brule River and bordered by Lake Superior,

charming grounds. Other historic sites include the S.S. Meteor Maritime Museum (the last remaining "whaleback" ship designed for Great Lakes transport) and the Richard I. Bong Veterans Historical Center, which honors America's top World War II flying ace. Outdoor enthusiasts will want to walk the trails and see the waterfalls of Amnicon Falls State Park. The home of Wisconsin's tallest waterfall can pair your group with a tour guide to explain how the falls were created from ancient earthquakes and lava flows that resulted in deep ridges and dramatic fractures on the Earth's surface.

Buses can travel along Highway 13 and the Lake Superior coastline before boarding the motorcoach-friendly **Madeline Island Ferry** for a 25-minute voyage to the largest and only inhabited Apostle Island. Visitors disembark in the town of La Pointe, which was once a Superior Chippewa spiritual site and French trading post before becoming a welcoming

tourism community. Group-friendly attractions along the shore include Woods Hall Gallery and Studios (which offers weaving demonstrations), the Madeline Island Historical Museum (which includes a 19th century fur company warehouse and hosts historical reenactments to depict the challenges of island life before modern technology). After enjoying a hot







beverage at Mission Hill Coffee House or lunch at the Beach Club, depart for the other side of the island and Big Bay Sand Spit & Bog State Natural Area. Guests can relax on the expansive coastline or walk along the boardwalk through untouched forests.

Groups further interested in Northwoods history will want to spend time at the **Northern Great Lakes Visitor Center**. This immense museum just south of Ashland houses exhibits that explain the region's Native American heritage, mining history and continuing legacy as a vacation destination with interactive stations and a movie theater. Guests can also admire the Community of Life Mural—six large vignettes that depict humans interacting with nature over thousands of years. Mobile guests can walk outside and experience the center's interpretive nature trails that display seasonal changes in flora and fauna. A park ranger can accompany your group along either the threequarter-mile boardwalk interpretive nature boardwalk or 1.2-mile Aldo Leopold trail that passes through restored wetlands and forests.


Farther west and bordering Michigan's Upper Peninsula is the town of **Hurley**, which offers mining history and easy access to over 30 waterfalls. Visible from the Black River Scenic Byway and several public hiking trails, the Montreal River is the natural border between Michigan and Wisconsin and is surrounded by several parking lots and picnic areas for groups to take in the crisp breeze and beautiful cascades created by these rock formations. Visitors interested in regional history will want to explore the nearby city of Pence to see more than 20 log buildings built by European immigrants and the world's deepest iron ore mine in the city of Montreal.


Dubbed the "Island City" and located in the heart of Wisconsin's lake country, **Minocqua** is an excellent hub for your Northwoods outdoor adventure and offers a variety of engaging attractions near its numerous group lodging options. Groups can spot elegant boat houses and wildlife with Minocqua Pontoon Cruises, which organizes group excursions on

Lake Minocqua and Lake Kawaguesaga. Up-close animal encounters also await at Wildwood Wildlife Park and Nature Center, the second-largest zoo in the state and home to friendly miniature goats and parakeets. Groups looking for high-energy entertainment can watch the world's oldest continually running amateur water ski team at the Aqua Bowl. The resident Min-Aqua Bats amaze spectators three times a week with daring synchronized choreography. Other area activities include group tours at Hillestad Pharmaceuticals and the opportunity to pose in front of The World's Largest Penny.

Coastal Roam and revel in all the ways you can take to the water in Wisconsin

Ithough Wisconsin might not be the first state we think of for a waterfront vacation, consider this: three sides of the state kiss the water in big and beautiful ways. To the north is Lake Superior and the rugged Northwoods. To the east are the bustling communities and sandy beaches of Lake Michigan. To the west are charming burgs along the Mississippi and St. Croix rivers. All of it represents hundreds of miles for waterfront wandering, and that is in addition to thousands of pretty inland lakes and navigable streams.

Get onto the water with a kayak, canoe or paddleboard. Take a seat for a scenic cruise, especially at sunset, and perhaps add cocktails or a meal while afloat. Stroll on a paved or planked riverwalk to leisurely explore the heart of cities large to small, including **Milwaukee**, **Green Bay**, **Beloit**, **Wisconsin Dells** and **Superior in Douglas County**. Swim, sunbathe, hike or simply linger at a lakefront café. Dozens of lighthouses in Wisconsin still stand as nautical beacons, especially along Lake Michigan. **Door County**'s 11 lighthouses is the highest concentration within the state. At the 1888 **North Point Lighthouse** in **Milwaukee**'s Lake Park is a museum of lighthouse history and 84-step tower to climb.

North Beach in **Racine** (next to the city's lakefront zoo) and Bradford Beach in Milwaukee are certified Blue Wave beaches, an indication of


cleanliness and environmental quality. Apostle Islands National Lakeshore beaches, on Lake Superior and near Bayfield, earn this same elite designation from the Clean Beach Coalition. See lakefront cityscapes through **Edelweiss Cruises and Boat Tours** in Milwaukee; some of these narrated trips veer onto the Milwaukee River downtown as well.

Learn about Lake Michigan history at the **Wisconsin Maritime Museum** in Manitowoc, Rogers Street Fishing Village in Two Rivers and the Door County Maritime Museum in Sturgeon Bay. For a Lake Superior education, board **Madeline Island Ferry** in Bayfield and find the island's nautically rich museum, or get acquainted with lake lore at the **Northern Great Lakes Visitor Center** outside of Ashland. Stationed in Superior is the S.S. Meteor, the world's last above-water whaleback ship. Excursions with Apostle Islands Cruises get close to Lake Superior's spectacular sea caves, whose windswept and dramatic formations are photographed in all seasons. Another option is to kayak to the sea caves. **Legendary Waters Resort** in Red Cliff is a popular lakeside spot for beginning the adventure.

To experience completely different waterfront rhythms, follow the Great River Road along 250 miles of Wisconsin and see the Mighty

Mississippi at work and play. A narrated ride on the La Crosse Queen, an authentic paddlewheeler, mixes nature and history lessons at a leisurely pace. Add an overnight in **La Crosse**, whose downtown is awash with riverfront dining, lodging and entertainment. Sixty miles south and past 600-foot-tall bluffs is **Prairie du Chien**, Wisconsin's second-oldest city and home to the riverside **Villa Louis Historic Site**, where costumed guides turn back the clock to the 1890s and immerse visitors in everyday Victorian living. Beautiful bluffs of sandstone etch the terrain inland too, particularly in and near **Wisconsin Dells**. That is where an **Original Wisconsin Ducks** ride on a historic amphibious vehicle traverses land and water. Tours began in 1946 after the ducks were retired from transporting World War II troops and supplies between ship and shore. No fleet of these wartime vehicles is larger.

Dells Boat Tours get close to dramatic rock formations, let passengers disembark and sometimes add dinner at sunset. Choose an Upper Dells or Lower Dells route: The two are separated by a Wisconsin River dam. Also in the Wisconsin Dells is the Tommy Bartlett Show, a waterskiing entertainment experience that has been thrilling Dells visitors since 1952. Performers create synchronized waterskiing formations, do incredible flips on a jet-propelled FlySki and jump over floating


obstacles. Group rates are available for parties of 20 or more, and the show pairs perfectly with a Wisconsin Dells itinerary. In **Madison**, three lakes – Monona, Mendota and Wingra – Iull and engage visitors. Rent a paddleboat or canoe for a quiet encounter with nature on Lake Wingra. Take a Betty Lou Cruise as a pleasant introduction to the two larger bodies of water; go for just the sightseeing or add a themed meal. The State Capitol is Madison's tallest landmark, but more recent architecture – Monona Terrace Community and Convention Center – is a reminder that you're in Frank Lloyd Wright country. Monona Terrace, on Lake Monona, was designed by Wright but not built until decades after the architect's death.

It is possible to walk around the lake in Lake Geneva, where the lakeshore path is 21 miles and passes one gorgeous mansion after another. Another way to see the opulence and hear the stories behind the structures is through **Lake Geneva Cruise Line**. Tours of the 13-bedroom and blufftop **Black Point Estate**, a beer baron's family getaway in the 1880s, begin with a Lake Geneva Cruise Line ride. It is a reminder that this city is where many of Chicago's richest businessmen vacationed. The vibrant vibe in Lake Geneva is in bold contrast to Horicon Marsh , a federal- and state-protected sanctuary for hundreds of species

of birds. The nation's largest cattail marsh is roughly 14 miles long and up to five miles wide. North of Geneva is Delavan Lake, which guests can admire during a stay at **Lake Lawn Resort**. A ride on the 76-foot Lake Lawn Queen includes views of five Frank Lloyd Wright-designed homes and the opportunity for a catered meal on the open-air deck.

Horicon Marsh Boat Tours uses pontoon boats to guide visitors into the swampy oasis, which is a tranquil habitat for a complex ecosystem. Visit **Horicon Marsh Education & Visitor Center** for additional details. A short drive north is Lake Winnebago, the largest inland lake in Wisconsin and an unusual fishing destination because of the robust sturgeon population, enough for a spearing season in winter. Stop at Lakeside Park in **Fond du Lac** or Menominee Park in **Oshkosh** to get better acquainted with the lake.

Lake country is nearly everywhere in Wisconsin, and that includes the Northwoods community of **Minocqua**, where anglers cast for bass, pike, walleye and muskellunge on the area's 2,300 bodies of water. The locals call it "Nature's Original Waterpark" because of the lovely range of settings and activity: waterskiing, fishing, swimming, boating and paddling. Public beaches and boat access are plentiful too – more proof that the Badger State is a water lover's dream destination.

WISCONSIN SPORTS

ome to three major league franchises, a rich tradition of winter sports and several minor league baseball teams, Wisconsin offers plenty of sports-centric activities for group tours.


One of the world's most iconic franchises and a founding member of the National Football League in 1920, the **Green Bay Packers** are a Wisconsin institution whose

fandom spans generations. If your group doesn't want to endure the elements of the "Frozen Tundra" during a game, stop by to tour Lambeau Field (the oldest operating NFL stadium). Groups will pass through the Packers' locker rooms, press box and sidelines as guides explain the Packer's unique distinction as the only publicly traded American sports franchise. Later, explore the adjoining Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame to admire Super Bowl trophies, Vince Lombardi's desk and memorabilia from a century of team history.

More sports history awaits across the Northwoods in **Eau Claire**. Future stars Hank Aaron, Bob Uecker and Joe Torre all played in historic Carson Park as minor leaguers, and the venue still hosts

the Eau Claire Express summer league team. The franchise offers several group ticket packages, including seats in the 10th Inning Terrace Fan Deck, Bud Balcony and Best Seats in the House along the first base line. Groups can enjoy plated five-course meals and alcoholic beverages at discounted prices while watching America's pastime. Be sure to snap a photo of Hank Aaron's statue before departing.

The Beloit Snappers in the South Central Crossroads also offer a group-friendly



baseball experience. Currently the Single-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, the Snappers claim former All-Stars Paul Molitor and Prince Fielder among their alumnus and have played in Harry C. Pohlman Field since 1982. Groups of eight or more can register for the Hog Heaven Special, an all-you-can-eat and all-you-can-drink pass to the party deck, while groups of 20 or more will receive discounted tickets and hear their name announced over the PA system.

> Surfing may seem like an unintuitive activity in a state thousands of miles from the ocean, but the waves of Lake Michigan offer plenty of challenge to aspiring surfers and have given **Sheboygan** the moniker "Malibu of the Midwest." Aspiring surfers

can visit EOS Surf & Revolution Board Shop for private lessons and rental equipment, while group members who prefer to stay onshore can relax and watch surfers from across the world challenge the waves along the beaches of Deland Park.





Theaters and other **live performance venues** throughout the state provide group tour planners with **crowd-pleasing options**

hether your group is looking for Broadway musicals, classical concerts, ethnic entertainment or just a lot of laughs, Wisconsin stages deliver. Indoors or outdoors, matinee or evening performance, mainstream fare or something a little quirky—the choices are many. Some places combine the show with a meal, an allin-one arrangement that tour organizers always appreciate.

The Fireside Dinner Theatre in Fort Atkinson, for decades a staple of motorcoach tours in south-central Wisconsin, embraces groups with open arms. A destination in itself, The Fireside offers not only a 1,000seat restaurant and 700-seat theater-in the-round but also four gift shops and a bakery. Fine dining, old-fashioned hospitality and Broadwayquality productions make the Klopcic family's pride and joy one of the Midwest's premier meal-cum-entertainment attractions. group's presence is announced in the theater, and there are cookies for the trip home, compliments of the bakery.

Dinner with a show is also on the docket at **Rosewood** in Delavan, a community in the Lake Geneva area. Lunch, brunch and dinner packages (with choice of plated or buffet menus) include a cabaret show by entertainers Mark and Gretchen Hladish and Jo Hodgins. Among the many themed shows staged throughout the year are *Cruisin*' (favorites from the '50s and '60s), *Heart and Soul* (love songs from the past and current artists like Michael Bublé), *Salute to Broadway* and *Christmas Remembered*. Groups of 35 or more may choose their show.

Dancing Horses Theatre, also in Delavan, presents dazzling spectacles of equestrian artistry. Horses in a variety of breeds perform with exacting precision alongside their trainers in a 90-minute show that concludes with Dancing Waters, which features hundreds of water jets choreographed in a kaleidoscope of changing lights. Special holiday shows are available from November to January. Packages include the performance, a meal and an exotic bird show with parrots singing, roller skating and playing basketball. On backstage tours, visitors meet the trainers and horses up-close.

The **Marcus Center for the Performing Arts**, a cultural magnet in downtown **Milwaukee**, is home to the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, Milwaukee Ballet Company and Florentine Opera Company. It also hosts touring Broadway shows, with this year's line-up including *The Lion King*, *My Fair Lady* and *Miss Saigon*.

Northern Sky Theater is a summer theater experience outdoors under the starry sky located in the beautiful Peninsula State Park in Door County. Only original musical shows are presented that have been created specifically for Northern Sky audiences. Shows are performed here before being seen anywhere else. In the fall season, head indoors to enjoy an original show at the new Creative Center Gould Theater.

Birch Creek Music Performance Center in Egg Harbor, on the campus of a music academy centered around an old dairy barn with exceptionally fine acoustics, is another entertainment option in Door

PRAIRIE DU CHIEN, COON VALLEY, LA CROSSE

ake on a new perspective in Prairie du Chien. Wisconsin's oldest community rises above the confluence of the Mississippi and Wisconsin Rivers and offers spectacular views from the bluffs. Your scenic River Road Tour starts here! Your first stop is a Villa Louis, where you step into prosperous life of one of Wisconsin's wealthiest historic families. Their Victorian home was restored to its 1890s British Arts & Crafts splendor. This historic site offers groups step-on and walking tours of the downtown and a behind-the-scenes tour of the mansion: an in-depth look at the Dousman family from attic to basement.

Then it's on to Coon Valley to see Norskedalen Nature & Heritage Center, a Norwegian homestead. Set in the dramatic Driftless Area of high hills and green valleys, this site is a combination of heritage that focuses on the Norwegian immigrants who settled here and the charm of natural setting. Tour the 1890s restored log cabin, take a refreshing walk along the trails and enjoy a box lunch in an open-air shelter.


Travel to La Crosse, "God's Country," and make a pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe. View traditional sacred art and architecture, take a walk along the Meditation Trail and visit the Pilgrim Center that houses a gift shop and restaurant offering delightful menu selections. The shrine has a fleet of golf carts and volunteers to transport your clients along the trails up to the Rosary Walk and Way of the Cross.

The Elroy-Sparta Bike Trail is 33 miles of wilderness that passes through three railroad tunnels. Make time for a stop at the Paul & Matilda Wegner Grotto - a fantastic garden of concrete sculpture decorated with thousands of glittering glass shards.

Head east to the Wisconsin Cranberry Discovery Center in Warrens, which details the history of the state's cranberry industry. Call ahead for your group tour of the Cranberry Museum & Exhibit Hall. Your guided tour includes a vintage ice cream parlor and cranberry gift boutique.

Before you leave Wisconsin, head south to Richland Center to the Town of Stevenson Museum. This fictional town boasts a unique collection of antique and vintage vehicles from the 1800s to the 1950s. Tours by appointment offer a walk through a small Midwestern town in a farm building with recreations of the Richland Center General Store and the Town of Stevenson Fire Department. Among the collections are a Lucille Ball look-alike who is staffing the "switchboard" and a purse owned by Elizabeth Taylor. Your group will bring home stories to last a lifetime.




