



Southern Africa Wine, Wildlife & Victoria Falls





Start your 11-day adventure with four nights in a mountain-facing room at Table Bay Hotel in Cape Town, South Africa's oldest city. Ride the cableway to the top of majestic Table Mountain for views of one of the most beautiful cities in the world. A tour of the recently restored Victoria & Albert Waterfront evokes images of 19th century seafaring activities, and the Malay Quarter impresses with its cobblestone streets, mosques and flat-roofed pastel houses.

On a full-day journey along the Cape Peninsula, greet Cape fur seals sunbathing on Seal Island and African penguins on Boulders Beach as you make your way to the peninsula's tip, where the Atlantic and Indian oceans meet. Another day-long excursion features winery tours and tastings in the Cape Winelands.

On a two-night stay at a private game reserve in the Greater Kruger National Park area, enjoy guided game drives in search of the Big Five—elephants, lions, leopards, buffalos and rhinoceros. Continue to Johannesburg, where highlights include the Soweto community and iconic sites like the Nelson Mandela House and Apartheid Museum. Fly from Johannesburg to Zimbabwe to experience the mighty roar of Victoria Falls, one of the Seven Wonders of the Natural World, and a sunset cruise along the Zambezi River.

Few destinations offer such a wide range of experiences - from spotting the Big Five on safari to sipping wine in Stellenbosch or hiking Table Mountain. It's ideal for groups with diverse interests."



Explore Ghana: Accra, Elmina, & Kumasi



Begin this nine-day trip to one of West Africa's most fascinating countries by exploring Ghanian culture at museums and monuments in Accra, the capital. Have fun shopping for colorful fabrics and other West African goods at the Arts Center, an open-air market. At a village on the Volta River, meet the chief and participate in a naming ceremony where each participant receives a Ghanian identity. Touring a bead factory, you can see how beads are made and even make your own item to take home.

In Kakum National Park, tackle the seven suspended bridges on the thrilling Canopy Walk high above the rainforest floor. Visits to the dungeons of Cape Coast Castle and St. George's Castle shed light on the trans-Atlantic slave trade, a disturbing chapter in the country's history. A cooking class lets tour members prepare and then taste their own creations of West African cuisine. In Kumasi and nearby villages, learn about the Ashanti Empire, one of West Africa's most influential kingdoms, and see artisans at work as they carve wood and weave cloth.

On your last day in Ghana, return to Accra, where you'll have the option of visiting a school for the deaf or a hair salon that creates the latest West African styles.

Prague, Vienna & Budapest: Central Europe journey

Your 14-day journey through Central Europe begins in Prague, where cobbled lanes, Gothic spires and the regal halls of Prague Castle set the scene in the city's medieval core. Spend some time in the Czech countryside and then explore the fairytale streets of Cesky Krumlov, an enchanting town dominated by a 13th century castle.

In Vienna, board CroisiEurope's 180-passenger MS Beethoven for a sevennight cruise on the Danube River. Port calls in Austria's picturesque Wachau Valley include Melk Abbey and the charming medieval town of Durnstein. After a stop in Bratislava, Slovakia, the cruise continues to Hungary, with visits to Kalocsa, for a traditional horse show; Budapest; and Esztergom, one of the country's oldest towns.

Your journey through the heart of Europe continues with five nights in Vienna, where the agenda includes Schonbrunn Palace, a performance by Lipizzaner horses at Hofburg Palace's Winter Riding School and a day at leisure. An excursion to Graz spotlights the narrow alleys and Renaissance courtyards of its UNESCO-listed Old Town.

Brazillian Gastronomy





On this seven-day exploration of Brazilian cuisine in Rio de Janeiro and Salvador, tantalize your tastebuds at some of the country's best restaurants, enjoy cooking classes, and visit historical and cultural landmarks.

Day 1 in Rio features a cable car ride to the top of Sugarloaf Mountain for views of Copacabana and other beaches, followed by a dinner of gaucho chefprepared meats at Fogo de Chao Brazilian steakhouse. The next day, ride the cog railway to the top of Corcovado Mountain, home to the gigantic statue of Christ the Redeemer. Then learn to make traditional Brazilian snacks and a seafood dish in a fun cooking class that ends with a delicious meal. Another day is devoted to tasting a variety of foods and beverages at markets, bars and other places in four Rio neighborhoods.

In Salvador, highlights include colonial landmarks in the Pelourinho neighborhood, the cultural hub for the Afro-Brazilian community. Other crowd-pleasers—a Bahian cooking class, a Bahia Folklore Ballet performance and Bahia's Carnaval House, a museum that tells the story of Bahian holiday revelry.

At Anhumas Abyss you repel into a dark cave and take a boat and snorkel by flashlight in the water to see the stalagmites. At Blue Lake Cave you will see an underground lake with sparkling blue waters. Bonito is paradise.

Athens, Mykonos & Santorini: Greek **Island Explorer**







This unforgettable 10-day odyssey through ancient ruins, volcanic islands and timeless villages begins in Athens. Highlights there include the Parthenon, New Acropolis Museum (with dinner in its restaurant), the stadium where the first modern Olympic games were held in 1896 and Temple of Poseidon in nearby Cape Sounion. Tour members have time to wander the maze of pedestrian streets in the Plaka, Athens' oldest and most picturesque neighborhood.

Take a high-speed ferry across the Aegean to the dreamy island of Santorini, famed for its whitewashed buildings and blue-domed churches. Go back in time at Akrotiri Excavation Site, visit wineries, explore traditional villages and relax at Black Beach, one of the longest black sand beaches in the Cyclades. More wine tasting awaits at a farm on Mykonos, an island known for its iconic windmills, art studios and quaint villages. A local chef will conduct a class in Greek cooking at a beautiful house in Mykonos.

After a ferry ride from Mykonos, the last full day of your Grecian tour concludes with a free evening in Athens to gather a few final souvenirs.





Ireland's Cities, Castles & Cliffs





This eight-day itinerary blends culture, spirituality and connection in a transformative exploration of Thailand's heart and soul. It begins with two nights in Bangkok at Ariyasom Villa, a small boutique hotel with authentic Thai touches, and includes a full day at leisure.

In Chiang Mai, learn traditional meditation techniques at Wat Suan Dok temple. A "monk chat" features insights into Thai spirituality and Buddhist monastic life. Spend the next morning with monks for an awe-inspiring alms-giving ceremony at mountaintop Wat Phra That Doi Suthep temple, whose terraces offer sweeping views of Chiang Mai. Continue to Wat Umong for a blessing ceremony with a monk.

The last three days in Thailand include a full day interacting with the gentle giants at Kanta Elephant Sanctuary, meeting Hmong hill tribe villlagers and attending the Yi Peng Lantern Festival with its cultural performances and breathtaking release of illuminated lanterns into the night sky.

Breathtaking Bali: Peaks, Palaces & Pristine beaches

While staying at Sadara Boutique Beach Resort, visit a clifftop temple high above the sea and catch a Balinese dance show on the first full day of your 12-day trip to Indonesia's idyllic Island of the Gods. The next morning, meet with villagers during a house visit and cooking class in Rumah Desa Bali. Continue to Jatiluwih, a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its panoramic rice fields.

The next day is completely at leisure unless you embark on an off-road buggy ride to Tambingan Lake, exploring orchards, rainforests and coffee plantations. Then it's off to Ubud, Bali's heart of culture. On the way, take in the island's largest and most important temple at Besakih and keep an eye on your valuables at Monkey Forest, a sanctuary for the Balinese long-tailed monkey.

Halfway through the trip, visit a shaman to learn about traditional healing techniques and blessings. A half-day river rafting trip outside of Ubud passes through deep mountain gorges, wild jungles and picturesque rice fields. Other Bali highlights include a full-day catamaran cruise to a beach club on Lembongan Island and an in-depth look at the Balinese art form of puppetry. You can even create your own puppet and see it come to life in a private puppet performance.

Culture, Coast & City

On this seven-day tour of the United Arab Emirates (UAE), you will be captivated by the trend-setting architecture, luxury shopping and vibrant Arab culture in its two most prominent cities.
